Changes in Special Educational Needs (SEN)

The Children and Families Act (2014) puts pupils and parents at the heart of discussions and outcomes about the support that is offered, ensuring everyone works together closely. This is a more person-centred approach built around the child and their family.

The Special educational needs and disability Code of Practice: 0 to 25 years (2014) states that:

- All schools have to produce a Local Offer for learners with SEND outlining their approach to; teaching learners with SEND, how SEND is identified, assessed supported, funded, monitored, other opportunities for learning and preparing for transitions.
- If your child has a Statement it will be changed to a Education Health and Care Plan within the next 3 years.
- School Action and School Action Plus Categories have been replaced by one single school based support category for pupils who need specific support.
- Four broad areas of need are used for identification, assessment, targeted intervention based support, monitoring and review.
- The four broad areas of need:
- 1. Communication and

interaction

- 2. Cognition and learning
- 3. Social emotional and mental health difficulties
- 4. Sensory and/or physical

"Top-up" Funding



The "Top-up" funding available for SEN and D pupils is given to the Cluster to be allocated according to exceptional need.

This funding may be allocated to help towards equipment, resources, training for staff, specialist advice and support or some direct adult support for an individual or group of pupils with the same need.

Parents will be informed if applications for funding are to be made.

- Schools can ask the cluster for money to support children.
- Schools must say how they have used the money and say how it has helped.

What are Special Educational Needs (SEN)?

A child has SEN if they have a learning difficulty or disability which calls for special educational provision to be made for him or her.

(Special Educational Needs Code of Practice: 0 to 25 years, 2014)

What are learning difficulties?

A child has a learning disability if he/she has a significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of others of the same age,

Supporting children with SEND at Walpole Cross Keys Primary School

A special educational need and/or disability can be a number of different things. For example, your child may be having problems with reading, maths or behaviour. Our school can help with this by identifying targeted planned extra support using appropriate interventions.

The interventions we currently offer to support our pupils include:

- Toe by Toe phonics 1:1 daily programme
- Power of 2 Maths 1:1 daily programme
- Thrive supporting children with personal, social and emotional difficulties
- Time to Talk/Socially Speaking—Oral and Social Communication skills
- Sensory Circuits
- Touch Typing
- Lego Therapy
