Class 2: Autumn 2

English

The 'Talk for Reading' and 'Talk for Writing' strategies will continue to be studied during this half term.

This half term we will continue from where we left off before the half term looking at writing a recount. We will become familiar with the structure of a recount, the language to use within one and plan and write our own. This will be assisted by reading the text 'Traction Man' The second half of the half term will be dedicated to learning the style of an explanation text.

Grammar/ punctuation sessions will happen daily during our English lessons. We will recap skills previously taught such as exclamation marks, inverted commas and learn new skills such as adverbs, using commas after fronted adverbials, noun phrases and using time connectives as signposts,.

In addition to spelling/ phonics and English we will have daily handwriting sessions to help children develop a confidence in writing using a cursive joined style.

Maths

During the second half of the term will look at strategies to solve addition and subtraction, including not exchanging and exchanging across 10s and 100s.

We will continue our learning by studying shape which includes times tables, strategies will be learnt to solve calculations quickly and efficiently.

Times tables will be taught regularly using 'Tackling Tables' By the end of Year 2 children should know their multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times table. By the end of Year 3 children should know their multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times table.

At the beginning of each daily maths lesson we will have an arithmetic session to help them build the four key skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. On Fridays the children will have a chance to apply these skills independently in their arithmetic tests. Misconceptions from the arithmetic tests will be focused upon and discussed to plug these gaps.
