## Year 5/6: Autumn Term 2

<u>English</u>	<u>Maths</u>	<u>Science</u>	<u>Geography</u>
In English lessons, the children will be learning how to write a recount/biography. We will be looking at two texts, The life of Violette Szabo and Suffragette: The Battle for Equality.	Year 6 In Maths lessons, the children will be looking at fractions. Including simplifying, comparing and ordering fractions. We will then looking at adding, subtracting, multiplying an dividing fractions Year 5 In Maths lessons, the children will be looking at Statistics. Including reading, drawing and interpreting line graphs, including solving problems. Reading and interpreting tables, including two-way tables.	In Science lessons, children will be learning about classification. They will be able to read and understand a classification key as well as understanding that scientists have divided living things into 5 large groups called kingdoms. They will also realise that all livings are made up of cells and will learn the difference between plant and animal cells. They will know how fungi, protists and prokaryotes are classified and know the similarities and differences between them.	In Geography lessons, the children will learn that about North America. They will look at the countries of, environmental regions, rivers and cities in North America. They will also compare the UK and a region of North America.

<u>History</u>	<u>Music</u>	Art	<u>RE</u>
In History lessons, we will look at The Suffragettes. We will start by looking at democracy in the 19 <sup>th</sup> Century. Then we will look at The National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies, before looking at the role of Emmeline Pankhurst and the WSPU. We will then look at the Anti- Suffrage Campaign before looking at World War 1 and the Representation of the People Act.	In Music lessons we will look at Classroom Jazz.	In Art lessons we will be studying Renaissance Art. We will observe and discuss a range of paintings by Italian Renaissance artists and become familiar with Renaissance sculpture.	In RE lessons with Mrs Mead, the children will be exploring the question What is a Church?
