English

We will be continuing to learn the traditional tale of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We will also be having a go at writing instructions about how to build a sandcastle.

Maths

We will continue to use the CBeebies programme 'Numberblocks' to teach understanding of the numbers and the number system. We will be looking at doubling, halving and sharing amounts as well as capacity, height, weight, length and size.



Phonics

We will be following 'Read, Write Inc' as a method of learning our phonic sounds, and how to use them to read and write. Children are grouped by ability and work with other children who are the same level as themselves.
