### Art - Space


We're looking at making our sketches look like they have 3 dimensions. Have a go at creating the classic 3d fruit bowl making the fruit look 3d.

### **Geography - Spatial Sense**

#### Year4

Draw your own desert Island on a grid and show the 4 figure grid references for specific places.

#### Year 5/6

Create a map of Europe and use the lines of latitude and longitude to show how many degrees North and how many degrees East/West places are.



#### RE - Sikhism

Draw a poster showing the 5 K's and state why they are important symbol for Sikhs.



#### History

Y5/6 Draw or Make a map illustrating the size of the British Empire at its height.

Y4 – Create a fact file on the Vikings or Anglo Saxons.



#### French - Food

Make a table of foods, one half food you like and one half food you hate. Draw the food and write their names in French.
