Children are expected to read daily, once they have been given a home school reading book. This will need recording in their reading record book at least 3 times per week. These are checked on a Friday.

Remember the homework challenges that are ongoing throughout the term. These are not compulsory for children in Reception.

PE

Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school every Monday. They can bring it home to be washed on a Friday but must make sure they bring it back with them after the weekend. Our PE day this term will usually be on a **Wednesday**.

EYFS: Autumn Term 1

Literacy

In Literacy lessons, the children will be learning how to retell familiar stories and make up their own. We will be learning the Set 1 phonics sounds of the Read Write Inc programme.

Maths

In Maths lessons, the children will be looking at counting, recognising and ordering numbers to 5 and beyond.

Understanding the World

In knowledge lessons, the children will be exploring the topic 'All About Me'. We will be looking at our bodies, families, where we live, how we feel and how to be healthy and safe at school.

Expressive Arts and Design

In Art lessons, the children will be using different colours to create self and family portraits. They will also be creating representations of different houses and homes.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The children will be settling in to Class 1 by making friends, playing with others, discussing their interests, learning the daily routine and gaining the confidence to talk to new people.

Physical Development

The children will be learning how to manage their own basic personal hygiene by going to the toilet and getting dressed/undressed independently. They will also be taking part in PE lessons and exploring physical aspects of the outdoor environment.

Communication and Language Development

The children will learn to speak with confidence during circle times and small group sessions. They will learn to listen and respond appropriately with relevant comments, questions or actions. They will also have the opportunity to share their own views and ideas.
