This document will help you to review your provision and to report your spend. We recommend you start by reflecting on the impact of current provision and reviewing the previous spend. Under the <u>Ofsted Schools Inspection Framework</u>, inspectors will assess how effectively leaders use the Primary PE and Sport Premium and measure its impact on outcomes for pupils, and how effectively <u>governors</u> hold them to account for this.

Schools are required to <u>publish details</u> of how they spend this funding as well as on the impact it has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment by the end of the summer term or by **31 July 2020** at the latest.
