Primary PE and Sport Funding 2016 - 17

What is the PE and Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million each year for 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in school. Each school receives £8000, plus £5 per pupil on roll. For this year, our total grant is £8215 (based on 43 children in school). At Walpole Cross Keys Primary, we pride ourselves on being a happy and **healthy** place to learn. We've developed an action plan to ensure this funding is invested (rather than 'spent') to maximise the long term impact of our PE provision for pupils and staff.
