PE and Sport Funding 2017 - 2018

## What is the PE and Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million each year since 2013 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in school. Each school receives £8000, plus £5 per pupil on roll. For this year, our total grant is £8230 (based on 46 children in school). At Walpole Cross Keys Primary, we pride ourselves on being a happy and healthy place to learn. We've developed an action plan to ensure this funding is invested (rather than 'spent') to maximise the long term impact of our PE provision for pupils and staff.

## The government guidance states Sports funding should be used to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

## For example, we can use our funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
