<p>Geography – The South West</p> <p>Create a persuasive leaflet to encourage children to visit the South West of the UK</p> 	<p>Science – Climate champions</p> <p>Design a poster that will teach children how to be environmentally friendly and help them to understand climate change.</p>	<p>DT – Designing with electrical circuits</p> <p>Create your own project that includes an electrical circuit. This could include a light, a motor or a buzzer.</p> 
<p>Computing</p> <p>Using 'scratch'</p> <p>Develop your own game and coding. Upload a short video of you playing it to class dojo.</p> 	<p>PE – Dodgeball</p> <p>Create a training plan to help you develop your dodgeball skills. Include a diagram and sentence or two to explain the activity.</p> 	<p>History - The cold War (Y5/6)</p> <p>Write a diary explaining what it would have been like living in Berlin during the Cold War.</p> <p>Alternatively, create a Cold War fact file giving information of some of the key events.</p> <p>James I (Y4)</p> <p>Create a fact file giving information about the Civil war or the Gunpowder plot.</p>

The above menu details a range of work for the subjects that your child will cover this term.
