Homework Challenges – Autumn Term 1 2025

We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular reading, spellings and maths/English/phonics homework that are set each week.

Art – Colour (Year 1) Tell an adult about the primary and secondary colours. Create either a hot or cold picture using the colour wheel (only use the colours on the hot/cold side of the wheel!)	Science – The Human Body (EYFS and Year 1) Draw a picture of yourself. Label the different parts of your body.	Geography – Maps (Year 1) Look at a map of the UK. On an outline of the United Kingdom (google it!) can you: • show where Kings Lynn is? • locate places that you have visited? • locate well known towns and cities like London and Edinburgh? • Can you say if they are in the North, South, East or West? Add a compass on to your map.
RE – The Creation Story (Year 1) Draw pictures and write captions to show the 7 days of the Christian story of the Creation.	PSHE – Being Me (EYFS and Year 1) Draw a self-portrait or create a piece of 3D art to represent yourself. Make sure you can talk about it.	EYFS Knowledge- Marvellous Me! Create a family tree. Can you write the names of the people in your family? E.g. Mum, Dad, Nanny etc. 

We do ask that everyone has a go at this homework challenge, so that all the children have something to share at the end of each term. Please bring your homework challenge work into school on the morning of **Wednesday 22nd October**. All parents and children are invited to the Homework Challenge Drop In, after school on the 22nd October at 3.15pm – so that you can have a look at the work produced!
