## Reading

Your child is expected to read as much as possible at home and this will need to be recorded in their reading record <u>at least 3 times per week</u>. We will try hard to ensure that reading books are changed every week. Reading is a vital skill which will support their reading, writing and phonics, so we cannot stress the importance of hearing your child read at home.

## Homework

Your child will be given a piece of maths or English homework via Learning with Parents. You should receive this on a Friday night and should be completed by the following Friday so that we can look at your comments and photographs that you have upload onto Learning with Parents, in class. If you have any issues with the Learning with Parent homework, please let us know.

There is a homework challenge for your child to complete each half term (Please see the homework challenge letter for more information). Your child will be able to choose which challenge they wish to do and bring it into school on the morning of <u>Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup></u> <u>October</u>. All parents and children are invited to the Homework Challenge Drop In after school at 3.15pm. – so that you can see what the children have produced.

## <u>Handwriting</u>

All Year 1 children will be taught to use a neat handwriting style, ready for joining up in Year 2. Please encourage your child to practise to form their letters correctly at home (e.g., when writing their name or completing homework).

### Water bottles

Please make sure that your child has a named, water bottle - filled with clean water - in school, every day.

## <u>Library Books</u>

On a Friday, your child will be able to choose a reading book to share with you at home. Please ensure that these come back into school EVERY Friday.

#### PE

Our PE day this half term will be on a <u>Friday</u>. Please ensure that your child comes to school wearing their full PE kit, hair tied back, and earrings removed/taped over (they need to be able to do this independently).

#### Trips

We are expecting to take the Year 1 to a Sports Festival this half term at Lynn Sport. We will also be taking a geographical walk around the village this half term too - using their map skills!

# Year 1: Autumn 1

# **English**

Cumulative story (work is based on the repetitive story Tom Cat).

- Capital letters
- Full stops
- Finger spaces
- Use a question mark at the end of a question.
- Use time connectives.
- Bossy verbs
- Use speech bubbles
- Write a label and caption
- Write lists.
- Write a sorry letter,

**Recount** (work is based on the book Mr Gumpy's outing).

# Maths

Place Value within 10 - To read and write numbers (both as digits and words). To count up to and back from 10.

Addition and Subtraction within 10 - We will be looking at how a number can be partitioned into two or more parts - the children will be using and referring to 'Part, Part, Whole Models' (see below), which will help with their number bonds, addition and subtraction.
