# What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Money muling involves individuals — very frequently young people — being recruited to transfer illegally obtained funds into and out of their bank account on behalf of criminals (often without even realising that's the kind of activity they've become embroiled in), and usually being allowed to keep a certain amount for themselves. It's essentially a digital form of money laundering. This guide highlights come of the fisks associated with money muling, and provides parents and carers with useful tips to help safeguard young people against becoming ensnared by this growing online hazard.

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# Advice for Parents & Carers <

If you have concerns, you might want keep a closer than usual eye on your child's online presence, including their profiles on social media and any gaming platforms that they use. These can often serve as useful early warning systems which might help you to detect any signs of attempted recruitment by criminals or other types of suspicious behaviour.

#### EDUCATE AND COMMUNICATE

k to your child about the risks and sequences of maney muling, emphasising importance of making informed decisions and king guidance if they need it. Create an open, n-judgmental space which encourages them to are their concerns and experiences, ensuring the I comfortable getting help if they suspect they n ve become involved in money muling.

#### STAY INFORMED

Criminals' methods and approaches to recruiting young people as money mules frequently evolve to reflect the online landscape. Try to stay aware of criminals' current tactics and make time to regularly check out resources provided by schools, law enforcement and financial organisations.
